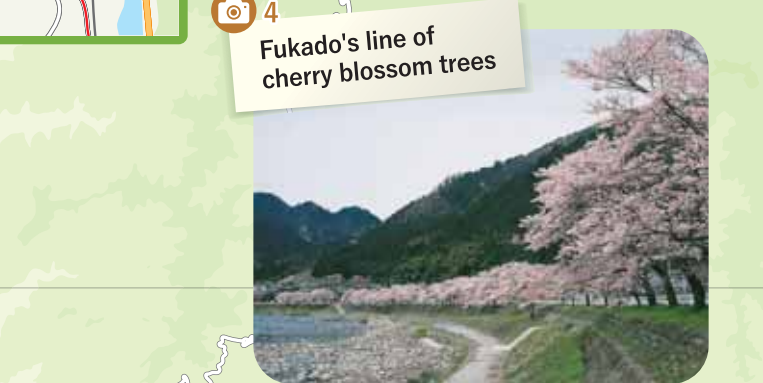
- S1 Hakusanbunka no Sato Nagasaki**

Gujo Hachiman, castle town of water and dancing

From Gujo Hachiman Castle, which stands atop the mountain, one can walk to what is said to be a town of craftspeople & blacksmithing and experience the traditional streets with their unique atmosphere and water channels. This town which plays host to many stores, both old and new, holds "all-night dancing" in the summer and attracts peoples' hearts throughout the year.

Mino-washi, with its history and tradition of 1,300 years

Mino, the town of 1,300 year old Mino-washi and Udatsu-lined streets

In Mino City, where udatsu rooves line the streets, there is a proud history of Mino-washi papermaking, which once paid for the extravagant houses of the merchants. It is a great place to walk, with many museums telling of the history standing in harmony with restaurants and shops.

Ascend by train! Descend by bicycle!

It is possible to take your bicycle on the "cycling carriage" through use of the advance reservation system. You can select freely the station to get on and off, so you can easily make a cycling course suited to your physical condition.

Town of historical drama, Gifu City

Many sengoku warriors including Oda Nobunaga, Saito Dosan & Akechi Mitsuhide had connections to the town of Gifu. In the early modern period, the town blossomed due to its favourable position for trade on the Nagara River and many crafts such as Japanese umbrellas and lanterns were created from the culture of the townfolk. Please experience this town through the landmark Gifu Castle and the cormorant fishing (a symbol of summer) which together encapsulate the history.



Seki, town of cutlery

Seki blacksmithing has a history of 700 years. The sounds of the blacksmithing would ring through the streets since long ago, and now the city is famous for more modern cutting-edge cutlery which has been expanded globally. You can taste the history and culture by visiting the museums and the many temples and shrines related to blacksmithing in the town.
